"I wanted to do something totally insane. And I think we've succeeded!" For Hase Bikes' 25th anniversary, Marec Hase gave his team an unusual challenge. The result is the "beast". Marec has yet to reveal exactly what it is: "For once, it actually doesn't have anything to do with bikes!"

The "beast" will be presented, and hopefully tamed, by "trainer" Waldemar Kobus. Anyone familiar with Waldemar knows that guests can look forward to spontaneous and moving performances.

"This project is very dear to me. I was extremely honoured when Kirsten and Marec Hase asked me whether I would like to play a role in the presentation," explained the actor. "And Marec has created such an adorable beast. I want to be there when it first sees the light of day!"

Kobus is known for several memorable roles, including his portrayal of the Viking chieftain Halvar in the two "Wickie" films, and for his work on several television series, such as *Babylon Berlin* and *Die Lottokönige*. A lesser-known fact about the actor is that he has been a passionate Hase Biker for 10 years. "When I bought my trike it was a prototype of the Klimax 2K. Since then, so many parts and features have been added, replaced or updated that it is now a completely customised Kettwiesel," reported the actor. "I use it for shopping, riding to work, short errands and even longer trips all over Germany."

The beast will be set free once again this summer, when Hase Bikes celebrates its 25th anniversary with a totally unique Open House at its headquarters on the grounds of the historic coalmine Zeche Waltrop. The XXL company tours will include areas that are normally strictly taboo, such as the design and development department.
